
Tuesday, February 28, 2023, 12:00 - 2:00 PM, including a light lunch.

MEN'S FELLOWSHIP

Presbyterian Man and Veteran, Jim Hart

This month it is my honor to write about a Presbyterian Man who served our country for many years, retired in 2008 and continues to serve veterans of the military. I want to acknowledge that I was able to use some interesting bits of information from an article published by Vero Beach Magazine and another from the office of Senator Debbie Mayfield who honored Jim as constituent of the week recently.



Rear Admiral James "Jim" Hart is a 33-year Veteran of the United States Navy. The distinction of Rear Admiral is the highest naval rank maintained

during peacetime, requiring commitment, performance, and leadership, all of which exemplify James Hart. During his Navy career he deployed on eight aircraft carriers and was assigned to six squadrons. He commanded at the Squadron, Air Wing, and Joint Task Force levels. As a Naval Flight Officer, he participated in the Cold War, Bosnia, Kosovo, and Iraq conflicts securing our nation's interests and safeguarding Americans and allies. In Bosnia, he flew on the first night mission, and in Kosovo, he was the Senior Navy Planner for the Air War. While in Iraq, he conducted precision strikes against military targets protecting American servicemembers and innocent civilians.

Ten years ago, Jim joined the Space Coast Honor Flight as a volunteer. He has served in every capacity that the veterans manage, and in 2019 he took on the role of President. SCHF takes our veterans to Washington D.C. for an all-expense paid visit to our nation's war memorials. At least 25 men from First Presbyterian have made this incredible trip over the years. Currently, 30 veterans along with 30 guardians, several staff members including a doctor and an EMT take the flight. Since 2010 over 1,700 vets have been treated to the flight. Each year a team of volunteers manages six to seven flights aboard Southwest Airlines. In 2023 six flights are scheduled starting in April. Space Coast Honor Flight is focused on making sure that World War II, Korean War, and Vietnam War Vets get their trip to D.C. They are always seeking Vets from these wars. The volunteers urge veterans they meet to sign up for the trip. Many grateful recipients of these unforgettable trips become volunteers after their flight.

Jim always mentions at the orientation for an upcoming flight that Space Coast Honor Flight is run by volunteers, and no one gets paid. For every dollar donated, 97 cents go to the veterans. The one-day, all-expense paid Honor Flight trip includes motor coach transportation from Melbourne to Orlando International Airport, flight to Baltimore-Washington International Airport, a bus ride to the memorials throughout Washington, D.C., all meals, and a return trip to Melbourne.

Besides seeing the beautiful memorials, the Vets always remark on the fantastic reception they have received at the airports and all around the D.C. area from crowds of enthusiastic visitors. Many of the veterans never got that kind of welcome when they returned from active duty. At the reunions one month after the flight, many have told how touched they were by the sights and crowds.

MEN'S FELLOWSHIP

Jim is unbelievably busy. Besides the flights and programs at the Wickham Center, and many fundraising events, there are four lunches each month for veterans, their friends, and families that Jim attends. These are great times where veterans and their friends can reminisce and keep in touch. The closest restaurant of the four is Cap't Hiram's in Sebastian. Cap't Hiram's supports veterans by giving them a 10% discount on all meals. All are welcome to attend on the third Tuesday of each month. Of course, Presbyterian men are very welcome to join us for breakfast every Tuesday morning. This month we began having breakfast at the 19 th Hole Restaurant at Vista Royale off US 1 in

Vero Beach. Great food and great company! For the last several years Jim has attended the Men's Fellowship breakfast. And even with his busy schedule, he still manages to come to breakfast at least twice a month. Several of the members of our church volunteer at SCHF.

Jim and his wife Lyn live in Vero Beach.



Profile of a Presbyterian Woman: Ashley Wright

Please meet Ashley Wright, the young woman who is in charge of child care during our Church services and also helps with Quest, the afterschool Christian based program at the church on Wednesday afternoons. She loves the little ones and seeing their smile with obvious pleasure as she responds and relates to them and they to her!

Ashley went through some tough times in her young life. As a foster child, she lived in different homes. She remembers it as a "sad time feeling that no one wanted her". At age 8, her Pre-K teacher adopted her and Ashley was happy that she finally had someone who cared. About that time, she began attending



First Presbyterian Church with her grandparents, Yvonne, and Kenneth, an usher and Deacon. (For those of you who were here during those years, you may remember that Yvonne helped with our Wednesday afternoon programs serving snacks to the children.) Then during her middle school years, Ashley was invited to join the youth choir by Stephanie Womack. Later, Pastor Fred Foy encouraged her to participate in the youth group.

As a teenager, Ashley connected with (then) Youth Director, Rob White. Rob's future wife, Tracy, became her friend and confidant. The "people at First Presbyterian Church helped mold the person I am!" She finds everyone at First Presbyterian to be so "friendly and accepting." She was baptized and confirmed the same day. Deb Pierce, a past Elder, says of Ashley, "Ashley has been a faithful servant of Jesus Christ since her confirmation here at First Presbyterian and a faithful member serving the youngest in our community. It is a joy watching Ashley interact with our children and the family ministries. She really cares about each one of them". Deb also tells a story showing Ashley's heart of love and deep connection to children. Deb relates, "I was talking to a young couple who asked if there was a nursery for an event and Ashley happened to walk up. She leaned down to the level of the children and called them each by name and welcomed them!"

Ashley believes in giving back to the community. She tried different avenues such as ROTC in high school and Early Childhood Education classes at IRC but decided against then. She also worked in restaurants as a server and found that she enjoyed meeting people. But, after 3 months of training as a medical assistant at the Treasure Coast Technical College, she found her calling. She now works with Dr. Peirone at Whole Family, a position she's held for three years.

In her free time Ashley loves to go to the zoo in Brevard and West Palm with her best friend Christopher. They also love to walk nature trails and visit historical places like St. Augustine.

Ashley's favorite Bible verse is Luke 10:27 "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and, Love your neighbor as yourself." We are so glad that Ashley is a part of our congregation.


