# **Giving as Invitation**

During November our congregation is engaged in our annual generosity initiative. For the past many years, the culmination of the initiative is our Consecration Sunday Celebration and Luncheon. We believe this process of promoting generosity and giving is faithful and authentic to the call that Christ places on our lives. We honor the truth that giving for the Christian is an "Invitation."

Over the last several years, First Presbyterian Church of Vero Beach has not been able to host a big gathering to celebrate the church's giving, our vision, and our mission. We were too close to Covid. This year we believe it is different. We are asking all of you to come out and celebrate in worship and to attend our Consecration Brunch on Sunday, November 13th. We are hoping this will be a joyous and festive time for our church family.

We celebrate our giving because faithful and sacrificial giving is an initiation. As the famous Dutch Catholic priest and writer, Henri Nouwen notes regarding the spirituality of our giving,

Giving is a way of announcing our vision and inviting other people into our mission. Vision and mission are so central to the life of God's people that without vision we perish and without mission we lose our way (see Proverbs 29:18; 21:1-9). Vision brings together needs and resources to meet those needs (see Acts 9:1-19). Vision also shows us new directions and opportunities for our mission (Acts 16:9-10). Vision gives us courage to speak when we might want to remain silent (see Acts 18:9).



When we encourage generosity through giving of ourselves and our resources, it is the opposite of "begging." You will not hear us say, "Please, could you help us out because lately it's been hard." Rather, we are declaring, "First Presbyterian Church has a vision that is amazing and exciting." We are inviting you to invest yourself through the resources that God has given you – your energy, your prayers, and your money – in this work to which God has called us.

Our invitation to giving is both clear and confident because we trust that our vision and mission are like "trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither. (Psalm 1:3) 1 During our Generosity Consecration Sunday, we invite you to give to the vision and mission of the church. In giving, you invite other people to share our vision and mission and to serve Christ faithfully and well.

# INVITE SOMEONE TO CHURCH!

Recently, I received an invitation to play golf. There was a lot to do both at the church and at home and I had to decline the offer. However, it felt good to be invited even though I was not able to go with the guys and play.

Most of us are grateful for invitations even when we are unable to accept them. They remind us that others are thinking about us, are concerned for our well-being and would like for us to be a part of the group. Did you know that 63% of unchurched Americans indicate they would respond favorably to an invitation from a friend or family member to attend church? People just like being invited, even if it is to church!

Most Christians struggle with the gift of evangelism. The Alban Institute estimates that 10% of the members of any congregation possess the capacity to share their faith with others in an effective way. That means that 90% of us wrestle with being God's instrument in helping others to decide for the Christian faith. Yet, while that may be true, 100% of us have the capacity to invite another person to join us in worship at church. As an added incentive do not forget to invite your friend or neighbor to join you for lunch after the service. Like any good host does do not forget to pay the bill!

Let me encourage you to practice inviting people to church. Inviting encourages and blesses others. We can invite people to church dinners, classes, special worship opportunities, and even to participate in the life and witness of the church. Inviting others helps make them feel special and welcome.



As Thanksgiving and Advent approaches, be sure to invite your guests/visitors to join in the life of First Presbyterian Church. It will bless both the inviter and the invitee! Some years ago, in a survey of twenty-two congregations in three major cities, the question was asked: "What brought you to this church?" The response was as follows: 2% of people came due to an advertisement; 6% came because of the pastor; 6% came because of an organized evangelistic outreach; but a whopping 86% came because a friend or family member invited them. Never doubt the power and grace of a personal invitation to church. Every member

knows at least one person who is just waiting for you to invite them to a church service.

And when your guest accepts your invitation and comes to church, don't forget to introduce them to the pastor!

#### PROFILE OF A PRESBYTERIAN WOMAN: PAT WEMPE

Pat Wempe was drawn to First Presbyterian Church in 1999 when she noticed a PW circle of crafting women listed in the Sunday morning bulletin. This started her journey in the First Presbyterian Church.

Every Thursday morning, this group would sew items to be sold at Christmas Tree Lane and Pat soon became known for her unique and clever American Girl doll clothes!

Pat not only learned to sew from her mother, but she still uses her mother's 80 yr. old Singer sewing machine to create unique and timely items. She gathers ideas from attending craft shows and fairs. Her newest creation for this year is "pockets" for Hand and Foot canasta. This talented lady with a shy smile, bright blue eyes and a dry sense of

humor has been a blessing to Presbyterian Women and to FPC.

Born in New Jersey and baptized in the Plainfield (CT) Presbyterian Church, she finished high school in Stamford, CT and attended Union Junior College where she met her future husband, Fred Wempe. They married young, started their family, son, Rick and daughter, Rebecca and moved to Norwalk, CT. Fred became a licensed realtor while Pat was a stay-at-home mother. Tragedy struck the young family when at age seven, son Rick, sustained a serious head injury. Pat and Fred prayed for a miracle and God answered their prayers. A surgeon was found and they were able to save Rick's life, but it was followed by a long recovery. It was a frightening time that drew the family close-knit, that continues today.

With the children grown, Pat worked in the accounting department for Guess Watches. After visiting a friend in Vero Beach, she and Fred decided to make Florida their permanent home. Pat attended Sunday morning worship at First Presbyterian Church and noticed the Crafting Group listed in the bulletin. Although Fred was raised Roman Catholic, he "enjoyed Tim's sermons" and accompanied Pat for Sunday worship service. Soon after, Pat joined the crafting group and she then joined the church.

Pat quickly rose to become the beloved leader of the sewing ladies and to represent them at PW meetings. Over the years, the group number dwindled down and Pat began sewing at home. The Quilting ladies continued the crafting for Christmas Tree Lane.

When Fred became ill, daughter Rebecca and her husband moved to Vero Beach to help. Rick also began traveling from California to help as much as possible. Fred passed away three years ago. Today Rick has temporarily relocated to Vero Beach awaiting a knee replacement—the family supporting each other once again.

With her family close by, Pat now enjoys water aerobics, and reading and of course, creating beautiful hand stitching creations that significantly add to the success of Christmas Tree Lane! Stop by and say hi this year!

John 3:16 is Pat's favorite Bible verse. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life."

# BICYCLE PROJECT AND SHOP WITH A COP

It is that time of year again, when we seek to be a blessing to children in Indian River County who are in need.

The purpose for these worthy projects is two-fold: First, to bring together our law enforcement members and our diverse community in a joint, good-will event.

Second, to bring joy to the heart of children in our county who have very little. Both events will take place before Christmas.

We are again participating in two projects:

1) Bicycle Project- we are collecting monies in order to assist with the purchase of bicycles for needy children in our community. The children will be identified by school resource officers and school personnel. They will be eligible to receive a bicycle free of charge. Parents will be responsible for purchasing a helmet for their child. The bicycles will be distributed by members of Crossover Mission and uniformed law enforcement members.





2) Shop with a Cop - Identified students will go shopping with a uniformed law enforcement officer who will take them to either Walmart or Target and allow them to purchase a toy or gift for Christmas. Usually, each child has around \$50 to spend.
