What is the Portrait that our Actions Paint?

We know the phrase "actions speak louder than words." We all want to be people of action! The business mantra states, "There is no decision worse than no decision at all." In our daily lives, we have to act and we have to make decisions. So, if our actions do speak louder than words, what are they saying about us? What are our actions saying about our Christian faith?

In our daily lives we act and make decisions constantly. We make decisions about what we shall eat, what we shall drink, what we shall wear (Matthew 6:25), and how we will treat others in the midst of our active lives. We decide to turn off the television and spend time in conversation with our spouse. We make the decision to play with our children when we are exhausted from a busy day. We decide how we will interact with coworkers and strangers. In those decisions and the actions that accompany them, a portrait immerses of what we truly value and, in essence, who we truly are. The question becomes, "Does that portrait begin to help us resemble and represent Christ in our daily lives?" If we examine our lives and if we ponder the portrait our actions portray, do we need to rethink some of our actions and behaviors?

Our faith has always called us to examine our actions. The Greek philosopher, Socrates, defended his actions at his trial by uttering the now famous dictum, "The unexamined life is not worth living." For Christians, this "examined life" is known as **repentance**. Strong's Concordance of the Bible defines repent or repentance as, "to think differently or afterwards, that is, reconsider (morally to feel compunction): – repent." Repent has

taken on a negative hue as the word as been used to judge or to condemn (repent or die). Yet, to repent is a journey in the examination of the heart and the reframing of our own self-portrait.

The simplest meaning of "*repent*" is to turn around or to go in a new direction. Some believe that repent became a military term meaning *to retreat and regroup*. To repent is to examine one's life, make a decision to change, and to move forward in more faithful and moral directions.

There can be no doubt that our faith requires action and examination. It requires that we face decisions constantly. Again and again in Scripture, we are called to act.

- It is Paul who calls us to be a giver.
- It is Paul who also says be a doer.
- It is in Genesis where God says to Abraham "Go!," and Abraham simply goes.
- It is God who says to Moses go back to Egypt and save and deliver my people.
- It is God who says to Elijah get off this mountain and go back to work.
- It is Jesus who says to the disciples you are to love one another.
- It is Jesus who says do this in remembrance of me!

So, in our examined life of faith and love, where do we see the need for repentance applied to our own lives? What new and healthier decisions with this examined life bring?

Summer is a great time to ponder deeply. To reflect on self-improvement, personal and spiritual growth, and to ensure that our actions paint an accurate portrait of who we claim to be and whose we are.

Get Ready for a Very Musical Fall Season

We have two very exciting concerts coming up in August!

First, the First Presbyterian Youth String Orchestra will present a Folk & Americana Concert on **Sunday, August 14, 2022, at 4:00pm** in the sanctuary. Admission is free; donations will be accepted during the performance and also online via the church's website. The suggested donation per person is \$10.



The Youth Strings Orchestra at First Presbyterian has become well-known in the Vero Beach Community as a high-quality youth orchestra with a history of award-winning performances and tours. Most recently, they returned from a music tour and mission trip to the Florida Keys. Over the course of four days the group, accompanied by the Youth Choir and Youth Winds & Percussion ensembles, they gave performances at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Miami as well as The Sanctuary Church in Ft. Lauderdale. While in Marathon, they participated in a service project helping to clean up the Crane Point Nature Reserve. In the past, the Youth Orchestra has toured through the State of Colorado and won first place awards in competitions at Disney World and Universal Studios.

The August 14th concert, under the direction of Dr. Jacob Craig, will feature Suite for String Orchestra by John Rutter, along with selections of American Folk favorites such as The Entertainer, Maple Leaf Rag, Orange Blossom Special, and even The Devil Went Down to Georgia. This fun and exciting performance will feature youth soloists as well as string quartet arrangements and is sure to have the audience clapping hands and stomping feet!

Donations will be accepted via a bucket upon entering the sanctuary, or, concertgoers may choose to watch the performance via livestream on the church's website, www.firstpresvero.org, and also donate via the "Giving" section on their website. Spotlight on our A/V Tech: Martin “Butch” Almberg

So who is this new guy who's been running our A/V booth in the sanctuary and recording concerts? It's Martin Almberg, whom we all know as “Butch”. He first came to us in 2019 when he was asked to record the performance of the Mass of St. Cecilia for Dr. Jacob Craig's Doctoral Dissertation. Since then, Butch has been asked to join the FPC Department of Music & Arts as our sound engineer.

Butch grew up in Islip, NY, on the south shore of Long Island. He originally came to Florida when he was stationed in the Air Force, and after his discharge he moved to Melbourne Beach to attend Florida Tech. He received his Bachelor's degree in Marine Biology with a specialization in aquaculture. His interest, at the time, was reef aquaria. Eventually, Butch started his own business, Reef

Rascals Aquarium, and built high-end custom aquariums. He owned that company for 17 years before selling it. Currently, he works at Indian River State College and manages the labs in the Biology Department. One of his current projects is designing a wet lab to provide students with the skill sets and experience for potential jobs at Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institute, Stella Maris Marine Institute, the Smithsonian, and many other employers along the Treasure Coast.

Butch has always been interested in music as a listener. Specifically, he gravitates towards live music and in more recent years began recording live music events. As it turns out, he wasn't alone in this endeavor and has since become part of what is referred to as the ‘taper’ community. A “taper” is defined as a person who records musical events, often from standing microphones in the audience, for the benefit of the musical group's fanbase. He has made about 700 recordings to date and loves sharing these with the public. He is currently building a recording studio at his house, too!

When asked about his favorite part of being at First Presbyterian, Butch says, “The quality and the diversity of the music I encounter at this church is by far what keeps me engaged week after week. Providing church audio every Sunday isn't always as easy as one might think, but the challenges are what make it interesting and engaging for me. As a bonus, I really enjoy the people I get to work with each week. Jerry and Judy, Peter, the orchestra and choir members, Pastor Tim... it's really been wonderful getting to know everyone in the church!”

Quest Kids Club Returns!

Quest Kids Club is scheduled to begin on **Wednesday, September 7th**, and continue through May 17th. Each Wednesday, First Presbyterian Church provides bus transportation to three elementary schools in the area (Imagine, Beachland, and Osceola Magnet). Parent drop off is always welcome and available. The program runs from **3:30pm-5:15pm and follows the calendar set by School District of Indian River County.**

Quest is always a fun-filled afternoon of snacks, games, crafts, music, and life application Bible studies. The kids love learning Bible Lessons from the Whirl Kids, fun animated characters that provide solutions to real-life situations. They are one component of the *Whirl All Kids* curriculum that engages the students in the ultimate goal of teaching them to love God and to love others. In addition to Biblical learning, the Quest Kids get to learn new songs and play instruments. The Children's Choir shares what they have learned with the congregation on the second Sunday of each month. They also have special performances at Wednesday night dinners in December and May.

The program begins with the children arriving from school either being dropped off by the bus or parents. They are hungry and usually need to expend some energy, so we enjoy a snack and outside play. Then, we proceed to inside where the kids are divided into groups based on grade levels. They rotate through stations of Bible lessons, music, and games/homework help.

Students can be picked up at 5:15 by being checked out with a designated adult teacher/volunteer. If you would like to volunteer for this wonderful community outreach program for kids, we kindly ask that you arrange that with the leaders prior to the day of the events. We invite and encourage all families to join us for dinner each Wednesday. More information on dinners is forthcoming.

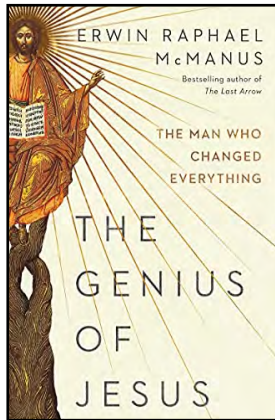
- 1) Protein/meat/nuts, dried beans

Labeled containers for donations can be found in the back of the sanctuary during the month of August.



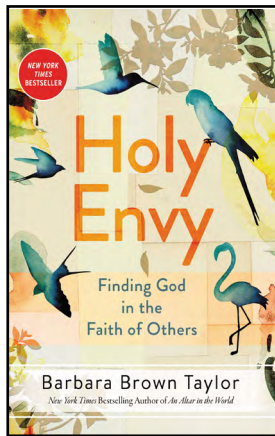

Profile of a Presbyterian Woman: Jean Hopkins

Jean Hopkins is a lovely 91-year-old woman who has been a member of our Church since 2008. I met her as she helped enter information into the computer system at Church for many years. She is a quiet and unassuming woman.

Sandy Thiel came to me and told me about a newspaper article in the Space Coast Living titled "Calculating Career went from Secretary to working on the Space Shuttle" written by Mary Ann Koenig. This article is about Jean and her work with the Kennedy Space Center. I was not prepared for what this humble woman of faith has accomplished!

Jean's career as a pioneering woman spanned 30 years. She worked with the team who returned the space shuttle program to flight after the Challenger tragedy. She was a small town girl who grew up in the Cocoa area town called Sharpes. Her mother encouraged her to go to college as she was an excellent student. In those days not many women went to college. She attended a Presbyterian school, Maryville College in Tennessee, and transferred sophomore year and graduated from FSU. Her father told her to get typing and shorthand training just in case! At the Space Center, she learned computer language to program the equations and was promised the first opening for a new programmer. As Jean says, "I always worked for nice people, I am so lucky." She began her full time problem-solving career as her work evolved from missiles to rockets and then to the space shuttle. In 1992, she was team leader for the calibration team, a group of five specialists establishing an on-going landing system for the space shuttle. After the space shuttle Columbia, Jean was honored for her contribution by a medallion and certificate signed by the shuttle pilots. An American flag that flew aboard the Columbia space shuttle is a prized gift from the shuttle pilots. It is framed and hanging in her Vero Beach home.

Jean now lives with one of her four children, Martha, in their Vero Beach home. Martha is a nurse practitioner and asked her mom to stay at home during the COVID epidemic. Jean loves to watch First Presbyterian services by Zoom. She has always been a Presbyterian! Her favorite Bible verse is Romans 8:38 "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

First Presbyterian Church is no longer hosting the Central Florida Presbytery Meeting

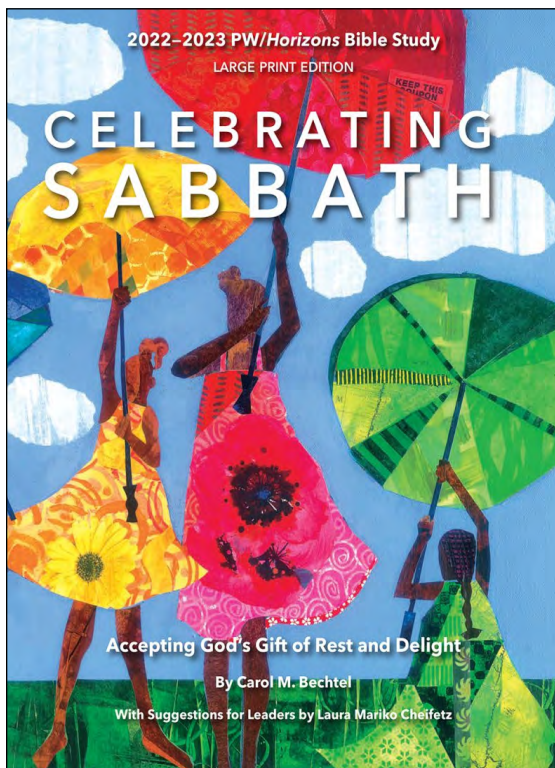
Due to the rise in COVID cases, it has been decided that this meeting will no longer be held as an in-person event. Instead, it will be held via Zoom.

A Dramatic and Awesome Life: Reverend Lisle j. Kauffman

When I approached Reverend Lisle and asked him if I could write a profile of his life for the FPC Newsletter, he handed me a nine-page autobiography and said he would be out of town for a few months. His story began with "I presided over 3224 funerals which comes to an average of 62 funerals a year for 52 years. And that is sharing in a lot of grief." Sadly, I cannot submit his entire story due to space constraints. So, I took the liberty to edit his words and have submitted an abridged version with apologies to Rev. Lisle.

He was born August 31, 1939, to Lisle E. and Virginia Jeanne Kauffman in Marion, Ohio. He had a younger brother Michael who went to our Lord in June of 2014. At age 16, he started work at The Great Atlantic & Pacific Tea Company (A&P) and worked for them until 1969. He graduated from Arlington Heights High School in 1958 and spent two years at Lake Forest College, Lake Forest, IL. He left college and enlisted in

the US Army where he took basic combat training at Ft. Leonard Wood, MO and was trained as an Armor Intelligence Specialist, (a Scout) at Ft. Hood, TX. He graduated tied for 1st place in Scout School. He served in Korea for 16 months attached to the 1st Cavalry Division. After leaving the Army he finished College at Elmhurst College in Elmhurst, IL. In July of 1964 he married Linda A. Tschopp. He graduated with a B.A. in Philosophy in 1965. He studied at McCormick Theological Seminary for four years working his way through college and seminary at the A&P grocery stores. McCormick's awesome staff prepared him for a lifetime of service to the church and the ministry to which God called him. While at seminary his son Lisle III was born. To help with expenses he worked nights for the Pinkerton Detective Agency as a night security guard.

After seminary, he was installed as Pastor to Calvary Presbyterian Church in Round Lake, Illinois. He retired from Calvary after 41 years of service so he could care for his wife who had been diagnosed with breast cancer on Christmas Eve 2009. Linda went to the Lord in 2013.

While Pastor at Calvary his service to the church included 25 years as the Assistant Stated Clerk to the Presbytery of Chicago. He was a commissioner to the General Assembly three times and served as Moderator of Presbytery in 1998. He wrote that one of his highest honors was with the Rev. Hector Mendez (Moderator of the Presbytery of Havana, Cuba) where they signed a document formalizing the Havana-Chicago Presbyteries' historic partnership on February 8, 1999. He believed then and now that they made a positive declaration to the world. Reverend Lisle served many years with various police and fire departments as a chaplain. His awards and commendations from these organizations could fill the newsletter! He led four spiritual pilgrimages to Israel (1996) (2006) with added side trips to Rome (1998) and to Jordan (2008).

After his ordination, he baptized his son Lisle and ultimately performed his wedding service. His son earned his PhD. in Deaf Education and has had three Fulbright Scholar teaching assignments to Ukraine. Reverend Lisle joined him for Eastern Orthodox Christmas in 2015. He presently teaches deaf children in Kansas City, Kansas. God allowed him to find love again when he married his new soulmate, Nancy, on October 8, 2017. She has journeyed faithfully and well serving our Lord as a pastor's wife.

In his spare time, he got his Private Pilot's License in 1974 and has owned and operated a Piper Cherokee 140B for 25 years. He has fished annually in Canada for over 40 years. Reverend Lisle and Nancy began their journey with First Presbyterian Church due to the influence of Nancy's grandmother, Rose Marggraf. She was a member of the church and sang in the choir in the 1960's.
