



Lessons of Christian Leadership



Leadership is not something any of us are born with. Leadership is a skill that we learn. Sometimes leadership is learned by being thrust upon us. There are times when we have no option available to us than to become a leader. Leadership is exerted by mothers and fathers, business leaders and politicians, parishioners and pastors alike. Leadership, whether subtle or explicit, must be active. As disciples, Jesus asks us to "do" this in remembrance of me and calls upon disciples to "go" into all the world. Jesus calls upon disciples (leaders) to be active in faith.

As we celebrate the 246th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, we can learn a lesson of leadership from a president that protected

and saved the union established by the Founding Fathers. The leadership of Abraham Lincoln can teach us much. In his article in NetResults Magazine, "Four Leadership Lessons from Abraham Lincoln," Christopher L. Scott shares four lessons of Abraham Lincoln's leadership. They are listed below.

Keep a Bible Nearby and Read it Often

Abraham Lincoln was mostly self-educated. Most self-educated people of the day began their education by first reading the Bible. Lincoln often read his Bible and memorized passages during his youth. Following his self-education and in his presidency during the Civil War, Lincoln dealt with his stress and melancholy as he read his Bible. He found comfort in specific stories that helped with the situations he was facing. It was from scripture that he understood that a "house divided upon itself cannot stand." Throughout Lincoln's presidency, he quotes from scripture again and again. When needing to lead with strength and integrity, Lincoln has his Bible on his desk.

Stand Firm

Leadership is leadership because decisions that are important are, by definition, difficult. Any historian of the Civil War knows that Lincoln made thousands of difficult decisions. If the President of the Union did not stand firm, the Union would have surely fallen. It was Lincoln during the Douglas-Lincoln Debates who said (paraphrased), "You can fool some of the people all of the time, and all of the people some of the time, but you can not fool all of the people all of the time." Possibly Lincoln knew of Ephesians 6:11, "Put on the full armor of God, so that you will be able to **stand firm** against the schemes of the devil". As leaders, whether as parents, in business, politics or in church life, we are called to stand firm in what is right and necessary.

Self-Led and Continuing Growth

Lincoln only had a year of formal schooling. One biographer commented on his ability to learn and grow: "He developed a confidence that he could dig into books for what he wanted, and would so repeatedly in the years ahead." 1

Lincoln never stopped learning. When he assumed the presidency, Lincoln knew little of military strategy. By the end of his Presidency, Lincoln was a hands-on, military leader. He continued to learn and grow. Continued growth is critical for all leaders and especially for Christians. The world continually changes and our strategy for sharing the gospel must also adapt or else it fails.

Actively Lead

Lincoln was an active leader. "He was involved in critical and difficult decisions. He made trips to visit his troops, he regularly communicated with his military generals, he nervously anticipated war reports as they came in over the telegraph machine, and he fired and promoted generals based on their performance and willingness to carry out his orders." 2

As disciples of Christ and leaders of the faith we are called to be active leaders. Working in an office, writing sermons and establishing policy, serving on policy boards isn't enough. We must spend time with our people (family, friends, employees, co-workers) and help them with their needs and hurts and share in their joys and triumphs.

"When studying the life of a great man and leader such as Abraham Lincoln, there are many things that can be learned about leadership. These four aspects of keeping a Bible nearby and reading it often, standing firm, self-led growth, and actively leading are great principles that can and should be applied to the lives of Christian leaders such as you and me." 3

We live in an age when Christians must be faithful leaders; parents, layleaders, and pastors. As we celebrate our nation's independence, let us lead by keeping a Bible near us (reading the scriptures), standing firm, learning continually, and being active!

A \$5.00 donation is appreciated. Please bring your own lunch.


Each session is self-contained, so you do not have to attend in sequence. You will be able to pick up any sessions you missed in our next 13-week cycle.

On June 19th, their adventure came to a close after waking up at 5:30AM to travel back to Vero Beach, where these amazing students immediately performed for the 10am Worship Service.



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Musician Spotlight: Judy Garrett



If you don't recognize the Garrett family name by now, you haven't been coming to church! The Garretts have been involved with First Presbyterian for decades. This month, we wanted to spotlight our very own "volunteer extroardinaire", Judy Garrett. Judy can be seen throughout campus on a daily basis doing anything and everything. She can be found smiling behind the reception desk in the church office, answering phones, organizing the Chancel Choir, serving on the Worship and Music Committee, putting together beautiful art gallery receptions, and running the A/V booth in the sanctuary during services.

Judy is the daughter of Florence and Forrest Baie, and is the middle child of three girls. They grew up in the Chicago suburb of Oak Park, IL. The entire Baie family is very musical, too! Their mother, Florence, played piano and organ by ear. Their home was always filled with music- including lots of singing and playing piano, organ, accordion and violin.

Judy remembers she and Barb would sing, and Judy always did the harmonizing. Watching Mitch Miller, Lawrence Welk and The Hit Parade, taught them the words to lots and lots of the "old" classics.

She met Jerry Garrett while competitively roller skating in the Chicago suburbs. Judy danced, and Jerry (a much more talented skater, according to Judy) skated dance and free dance in singles and pairs. They were married in 1971. Jerry's career took them to Southern Indiana near Evansville in the 80's and in the 1990's they relocated to Vero Beach. They were only supposed to be here for 2-3 years, but here they are 30 years later and happy to call Vero Beach their home. Together they have three daughters; Robyn, Stacy, and Shelly. So far, they have been blessed with eight grandchildren and one great-granddaughter.

Music has always been Judy's passion. Outside of Evansville Indiana, she sang with a group of ladies called "The Choral Connection" and for about 7 years they did shows all over the Tri-State area. Along with sacred music, they also did songs by the Andrews Sisters, Maguire Sisters, and Big Band songs from the 40's. Speaking of Big Bands, Judy also was one of the lead singers for a big band in Evansville called The Temple Airs. They performed three-hour dinner/dance shows for non-profit organizations who wanted to raise money. The group charged nothing – it was totally free – and they raised millions of dollars for various charities and groups! Judy says, "That was a blast – and very rewarding to help these great causes. At one show "The Lettermen" were in the town where we played and they stopped by our venue to hear us! That was awesome!"





Judy is also a wonderful songwriter. Most memorably, she composed the Sesquicentennial Hymn for their church in Indiana entitled, "This Is Our Moment This Is Our Time", and the 50th Anniversary Hymn for First Presbyterian Church entitled, "This Blessed Day'. Her proudest musical moments have been singing with her three daughters in a group known as "The Key of G" for First Presbyterian though the years. This vocal quartet started when the ladies were asked to sing for Christmas Eve service over 20 years ago. That

turned into many wonderful singing moments at church and even a full-blown concert! Fast forward to the present, and now Judy enjoys singing with her grandchildren as well. She also loves cooking- especially baking for their large immediate family of 18 in Vero Beach. She loves making desserts and trying new recipes.

Judy has been singing in the Chancel Choir for nearly 27 years and has loved every moment. Over the years, members have come and gone but Judy says that the wonderful loving spirit of this choir never seems to change. Judy says, "Having Jacob as our director has only added to that special feeling we all have together. He is so very patient and loving to everyone – teaching and encouraging all of us and challenging us to expand our singing abilities to heights we never knew! I always enjoy helping Jacob in any way I can – sending the choir email reminders, making copies of music, filing, etc. He is like family to me – the son I never had." Her all-time favorite choir piece is "The Majesty and Glory of Your Name" by John Rutter. Singing that song always makes her feel like she is having a personal conversation with God. The words are utterly beautiful and fill her heart with pure joy and love for Jesus Christ.



The Genius of Jesus: The Man Who Changed Everything


by Erwin McManus



Do Not Go Gentle into that Good Night: a profile of Dr. Jacob Craig

Dr. Jacob Craig is responsible for conducting, leading, and overseeing all worship, music, and arts programs. These include the Chancel Choir, Handbell Choir, Youth String Orchestra, PRIMO School of Performing Arts, Galleries at First Pres, Concert Series, and Special Services. Jacob received his Bachelor of Music Education and Piano Performance degree from Shorter University in Rome, GA before moving on to Tallahassee, FL to receive his Master of Music in Choral Conducting and Literature under Dr. Andre Thomas at Florida State University. As of 2019, Jacob completed his Doctoral Degree in Sacred Music (DSM) in Performance at the Graduate Theological Foundation and Oxford University. He serves as Director of the Vero Beach Choral Society, ACTS Choristers, Sea Oaks Chorus, John's Island Singers, and Silver Tones community choirs. Jacob is also a competitive highland Bagpiper and Pipe Major of the Vero Beach Pipes and Drums. Many of you already know about Jacob's role with our church, but his early life is probably not as well known.

Jacob was born in Blairsville, North Georgia in the heart of the Blue Ridge Appalachian Mountains. The family was 12 miles out from town and had five acres in that mountainous area. Early on, his father instilled an idea of success based on a strong work ethic and intelligence. By the age of seven, Jacob had his first job on a nearby farm. He was paid in fresh vegetables, which he then sold to people in a local RV camp. He and his two younger siblings - a brother and sister - were homeschooled. Their parents had to inform the local superintendent and get permission to operate as a private school. This was possible because Georgia law did not define "private school".

As a child, Jacob had no real interest in playing musical instruments, but that changed at age five when it was decided that he would take piano lessons from the preacher's wife. After two years, his teacher reported that he played piano better than her! Then he was enrolled in a music school in Cleveland, GA - 90 minutes from home. His parents would drive him to lessons until he was old enough to drive himself.

Jacob's Scottish heritage has always been a big influence. At age eight, he started playing bagpipes and continues to play to this day. Music became a requirement in his life. After high school, he had an opportunity to play piano as an accompanist for some friends when they auditioned to attend Shorter College in Rome, GA. Jacob was asked if he was trying out and he said, "oh no, I am joining the Air Force to be a pilot". They suggested he play for them anyway and when he finished, they offered him a full scholarship. He got his master's degree at age 22. He wanted to continue to a PhD program, but Dr. Thomas recommended he teach for two or three years so his resume would be stronger. Dr. Thomas had just the place: Ridgeway High School, an inner-city school in an underserved area of Memphis. Jacob taught there three years.





After teaching, he was ready for a change. A friend told him of a job opening on a Celebrity Cruise ship. Jacob negotiated for a six-week contract as the jazz orchestra conductor. Jacob was very interested in a "shore" job when a friend advised him that First Presbyterian Church was looking to hire a music and arts director. He applied and got the job. On the second Sunday in November of 2012, his son Landon was born 27 weeks premature. He is now a very healthy 9 year old and has done well.

In the ten years we have been blessed with Jacob's presence, he has become accomplished in many different activities- he is SCUBA Res-

cue certified, trains in competitive boxing, and also recently received his Private Pilot's License in order to participate in aerobatics competitions in a Yaklovev Yak-52 Russian Trainer Aircraft co-owned by Colonel Pritchard. He is also an accomplished horseman who has specialized in desensitization training for hunting horses and leisure trail riding.
