Music Man Comes to First Presbyterian Church

"Music, early on, did not come easily to me," says Peter Mahtani. "I always had a love of music, but learning to be proficient in voice, playing the piano and organ, and being comfortable performing before an audience can still be a challenge. As I continue to grow as a musician, I see these challenges as blessings. These challenges continue to help me become a much better teacher of music. I not only can understand my students' problems but I can identify with them."

Well, it would appear that Peter also is a quick learner. At age 29, he is accomplished at singing bass, playing the organ and piano, and conducting choirs. He also has a Bachelor of Music Education with concentration on Organ and Voice from Grove City College, and a Masters of Music in Choral Conducting from Messiah College. Peter joined First Presbyterian as Associate Music Director of First Presbyterian Church in July 2021.

"Peter was undoubtedly the most desirable candidate for this job, and every moment he has been here has shown why through his remarkable skill, engagement, magnetism, and professionalism," says Dr. Jacob Craig, Director of Music and Arts. "His primary responsibilities entail the start of all new youth-focused



programs including a phenomenal youth choir, youth handbell choir, and many other educational components," says Dr. Craig. "In addition, Peter is hard at work developing the excellence and engagement of our 8:30 am service, and already he has transformed the musical offerings at that service."

Peter brings a world of cultural and heritage awareness rarely experienced in Vero Beach and at First Presbyterian. His mother, Gek Hong, is Chinese and his father, Jai, is Indian. Both of his parents were raised in Singapore. Although his father's parents were Hindu and his mother's parents were Buddhist and Taoist, Peter's own parents met each other when they were in high school at a Christian camp.

His father became a protestant minister, receiving his education in Grand Rapids, Michigan. Later on, he was sent to be a missionary in Singapore and then back to the United States serving as a pastor in Houston, Texas and then in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Peter is one of eight siblings. Two of his brothers were born in Grand Rapids while his father was in seminary, and Peter was born in Singapore.

When asked what he could considered to be unique about himself, he quickly replied, "I know how to work, and work hard and enjoy working. In a large family involved in Christian ministry, money often is somewhat scarce. I started working at thirteen in the food service industry and continue to work at Olive Garden in Vero Beach twice a week. Working as a server not only gave me a good salary but taught me to be of service to others and gave me the joy of companionship with other employees."

Prior to joining First Presbyterian, Peter was General Music Teacher and Director of Choral Activities at Trinity Christian School in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania for seven years. He took a high school chorus of six members and grew it to an ensemble of 65 members. He taught music at the elementary, middle and high school level. He organized and managed a high school choir and chamber choir that traveled over the years to Toronto, New York City, Nashville, and Chicago. His students had several opportunities to perform at professional venues such as PNC Park (Pittsburgh), The Upper Room Chapel (Nashville), and St. Patrick's Cathedral (New York City).

"I see my job at First Presbyterian as not only teaching my students to be good musicians but good and decent people who enjoy being of service to others as well as themselves," says Peter, "and, having a lot of fun as well."

Peter had a few other job opportunities before making his decision to move to Florida. "Within a couple of hours in talking with Jacob, I knew this opportunity at First Presbyterian working with someone as talented and accomplished as Dr. Craig was exactly where God wanted me to go. The beaches at Vero Beach also were a huge attraction. Let's see, stay in Pittsburgh with its winters or Vero Beach with its beaches... That's not a difficult decision."
