Claiming the Best Practices of Faith

In our world of self-help and personal advancement, we often focus on engaging in "best practices." We seek best practices as parents who want the best for our children. We engage in best practices at work so that we are productive and our clientele is cared for. We pursue best practices in regard to our health and physical care so that we may live long and joyous lives.

We must also seek best practices when it comes to our spiritual well-being. The pandemic, over the last two years, has changed how we have pursued our spiritual life. Some of our examinations and pursuits have been very meaningful and we should continue engagement in them. Some, however, have not been as healthy for our spiritual well-being, and we should move to a new place: a place of "best spiritual practice."

The past two years have taught us many important spiritual lessons that we need not forget. We need to remember that life changes whether we desire it to or not. We need to remember that life is precarious. We need to remember that we live in a broader community and our individual decisions impact those around us. We have learned that nothing, in all creation, neither health nor pandemic, can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ.

During these past two years, we have embraced practices that have not been the best for our personal and spiritual growth. Some of these include, but are not limited to:



- Binge-watching TV shows that are probably not very good for us to be watching in the first place;
- Attending Zoom meetings wearing a professional top (on camera) with gym shorts and fuzzy slippers (off-camera ...who would know?); and
- Becoming overly comfortable with worshipping God remotely.

We have become much more comfortable with being distant from others. There also exists the danger of becoming distant from God. While our health precautions have been paramount, we must ask the question: "When is it safe for me to return? When do I return to in-person worship? Am I comfortable in a routine that is hindering my worship of God?"

We at the church would not ask you to compromise your personal physical health! Yet, if we are traveling on planes, if we are dining out, if we are engaging socially with others, if we are attending sporting events, is it time to consider "socializing" with God? We are so excited that Live-stream, Facebook Live, and Zoom have helped us by being a bridge during the past few years. The best technologies are no substitute for praising God in the midst of in-person worship. Possibly, for most of us, it is time to re-claim the best spiritual practice of worshiping and praising God in the "midst" of the congregation.



Beginning on October 3rd, First Presbyterian will again return to three Sunday worship services at 8:30am, 10:00am, and 11:15am. While we realize that these times are not preferable for everyone, they will allow for more space and social distancing as our worshipping population increases.

There is no doubt that remote attendance is no substitute for in-person worship. Please know, when you are ready, when your health care precautions permit, when you seek to re-claim your best spiritual health practice, we are open, safe and ready to have you back!

However you are presently able, remember the beginning and end of the last five Psalms, "Praise the Lord!"

Finances, Consecration Sunday, and Continued Uncertainty

During these difficult and tumultuous times, First Presbyterian Church is doing more than hanging in there. First Presbyterian Church is thriving in many ways! We are asked continually, "How is the church doing? How are our finances? How will we move forward in the midst of so much uncertainty?" The short answer is, "We are doing as well as we can as we strive to do ministry in a pandemic. We are okay, financially, as of today. We will move forward as we always must, in faith!"

Before we examine our finances and generosity, our driving desire is to care for each of you as best as we possibly can. It is difficult for the church as we are often defined as a "congregation." It is indeed difficult for a "congregation" that cannot "congregate" as we have in the past. Over the past few months, we have slowly been able to increase our ability to be together, but even now, the new Delta variant is a threat to the modest gains we have made. We will continue to do our best and we want to thank all of you for your prayers, participation and continued commitment. You have done an amazing job caring for each other and being the church of Jesus Christ in a time of struggle.

Financially we are in a neutral position as both revenue and expenses are below budget. We are covering our expenses so far for 2021 through your continued support; however, current cash flow falls short of covering several budget programs and events. First Presbyterian Church could be under significant pressure if expenses increase. We still have before us three difficult months in 2021. Yet, through your continued generosity and prayerful support, First Presbyterian Church will come through this time of pandemic stronger and more faithful than ever!

As we look toward 2022, we begin focusing on the future and our congregation's stewardship initiative utilizing the **New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program** as a way to continue to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

Please know this as you prayerfully discern your support for your church: we know this is a difficult time for so many. Some of you have been negatively impacted financially by this pandemic. We understand. If you are able to financially support the church in 2022, we celebrate! If you are only able to participate in worship and ministries and pray for us, we celebrate!

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, November 14th, either on Livestream or in the sanctuary, we are asking our friends and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world. Every friend and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily. Even if you are unable to complete an *Estimate of Giving Card*, we strongly encourage you to attend worship that morning, in the usual way, via Livestream, or in person. Spiritual generosity is always a matter of faith and of the heart. No one should feel compelled or pressured. If COVID measures allow, we will be having a celebratory brunch for everyone after each service in McAfee Hall.

Especially during this time of COVID, we will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship on *November 14th*, our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship, whether on-campus or virtually. It is the church's hope that the *Estimate of Giving Cards* will be returned either that morning in Church, sent back by mail, or emailed to the Church within the week of November 14th.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday services through the Consecration Sunday team, our church Elders, Deacons and Trustees. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship on *November 14th*.

Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday worship.



Ginny Bauer was teaching me, and Kimberly came to learn. Thank Goodness she was there as it is a huge and complicated machine! And as Kimberly sensed my reluctance, she took over. I asked if I could write this article about her. Fred Foy was standing there and encouraged us! When I told Kimberly I would need her favorite Bible verse, she immediately repeated Joshua 1:9! "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." Tim Womack also heard Kimberly, and said he was using the verse the following Sunday. There are no consequences in God's world!

Kimberly grew up in Michigan and went to a Lutheran grade school. Her father is a retired pastor with the Seventh Day Adventist Church and still lives in Michigan. She visits him every summer. When Kimberly was a teenager, she moved with her mother and stepfather, Greg, to Vero Beach. Greg worked for John Schumann, a member of our Church, at The Press Journal. Kimberly remembers when her stepdad became ill with cancer. John was very kind and supportive until Greg's death. Later, Kimberly moved to Orlando and met her husband. He was a professional baseball player, and they traveled all over the US and internationally. She loved seeing new places and learning new cultures. When they divorced, she returned to Vero Beach where her family lived.

Kimberly's grandfather was a special person in her life. After her divorce, she and her grandfather would attend Church every Sunday at Grace Lutheran. They would go to lunch and have great talks about life. He gave her such comfort and reassurance and helped build her faith. This relationship was healing for both of them as her grandfather was not well. He passed away the following summer from cancer. Kimberly says simply that God has provided for her. She also helped her brother while he healed from mold toxin that he developed from being a firefighter. He lived with her for 2 years until he was healed. During this time, they realized they were a good team and still share a home. Family is such a blessing!

Kimberly received her Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration and is now working on her Master's Degree in Forensic Accounting. She loves learning and educating herself! She also loves outdoor activities ... golfing, hiking, and any water sports activity. Other hobbies are reading, writing, painting, photography, and gardening.

Space Coast Honor Flight: A Letter of Thanks


To my Dear Friends,

Many of the notes were from members of our church and my choir family. I will simply say thank you for your outpouring of love and affection, and for sharing your love for this great country in which we live. And, thank you to my very special friend, Dr. Jacob Craig, who accompanied me as my guardian, pushing me around Washington in a wheelchair and never leaving my side for the more than twenty-four hours we were together.





During this Honor Flight, we visited many memorials honoring those servicemen and women who fought for their country and never returned home to their loved ones. It was a poignant and emotional experience. We participated, side-by-side with the Honor Guard, in the placing of a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. With hundreds of people watching, I'm sure there was not a dry eye in the crowd.
