## **Summer Studies**

From the beginning of the Reformation in 1517, when Martin Luther invited others to debate with him theological issues, biblical discussion, dialogue and debate has been a critical part of the faith journey of Christians. Without thoughtful biblical study and engagement, such dialogue and discussion is impossible. For Christians, it is important to understand how the Bible continues to speak to us and guide our living. Bible study, and theological study in general, offers us the opportunity be disciplined in our examination of faith.

For this reason, First Presbyterian Church continues to host our current offering of classes, with the addition of several more. We are going to dive a little deeper this summer. As we know that many within our congregation are snowbirds, vacationing, or traveling during the summer, we are offering two additional classes that will be zoom-based. These will also be available through our website, and each will have an established weekly "open office" time for participants to seek answers to questions or to make and share personal commentary.

The first class we begin in June (exact time and day TBD), focuses on the need to be "A Modern Apologete." An apologete is one skilled in apologetics. In our modern age, every Christian needs to be devoted to the defense of the "divine origin and authority of Christianity." In less scary language, regular old Christians need to be able to explain why they practice their faith to their children and friends. This should be bound in clear and defined reasoning. It does not have to explain everything, but simply what we believe and why we do, what we do.

It addresses these questions with a thoughtful and challenging book by Brian McLaren, "Do I Stay Christian?: A Guide for the Doubters, the Disappointed, and the Disillusioned."

The second study in July and August, will focus on "Everyday Theology: What You Believe Matters." In this study we will examine the power of belief, and thus, the power of action. Mary Wiley reminds us in this study that theology matters for you in your everyday moments, questions, and decisions. It's for the big and little, the exciting and mundane. Our theology is the basis of our faith and touches every part of our existence.

Again, exact date and time is TBD. This will be an interactive Zoom class.

Let's keep our theological minds engaged as we move through this summer. Let us plunge deeper into our theological conversations this summer. As we continue to grow in our educational offerings, please feel free to recommend subjects or topics that would be helpful for you to study.

When they joined, Carie Robins was the Director of Christian Education and she was wonderful too! So the parents listened to their kids!

Jason's sister, Sara, helped drive them from Spokane,WA to Kansas City. Then Jason flew into Kansas City and drove them to their new home in Vero. They came at the perfect time. The Jeffries have just learned that their daughter, Abbie, after being treated in the hospital for a week from high blood sugar, was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes. Jason's parents were able to help out with getting Ryleigh to and from violin lessons and bell lessons. Families are a wonderful Blessing!

Jason and Christie love camping in the US such as South Carolina, Georgia, and different places in Florida. They ski in Winter Park, CO every winter break with the kids. They hope to get Eli up on skis next winter break. When Christie has time, she loves to work out and swim with their kids and visit the beach. They attend the 9:30 service and when needed Christie will help teach Sunday School and help in the nursery. She has also helped at VBS! Isaiah 40:31 is Christie's go to Bible verse: "those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." We are so happy to have the Jeffries family a part of our congregation!






