MEN'S FELLOWSHIP

Presbyterian Men's Fellowship - J. Andrew Burnam, M.D.

The men of the Presbyterian Fellowship always refer to the good doctor as "Dr. Andy". He was born in the small town of Cordele, Georgia. His parent's families had migrated to Georgia from the Carolinas. Andy was raised in a large Baptist church that was part of the Southern Baptist Convention and he described it as a busy and wonderful experience in his Christian life. When it came time to attend college, Andy decided on the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill where many family members had attended in the past.

He met his future wife, Gloria, while attending a summer school class in physics. She had been attending Agnes Scott College in Decatur, Georgia. Her father, a physician, liked to say that "one is not properly educated without a course in physics". Soon after that Andy entered medical school at Chapel Hill and Gloria transferred to North Carolina to complete her senior year. They married in 1960. Gloria was reared in the Miami Shores Presbyterian Church and that would influence their future in Christianity.

Once Andy completed his M.D. at UNC, he entered the surgical internship program at Duke University Hospital. Their first child, Mark, was born at that time. It was while he interned that Andy realized his main interest was otolaryngology, the study of head and neck reconstructive surgery. After completing a year of surgical specialties, especially plastic surgery, he entered the otolaryngology program and completed his studies in 1968.

Andy had been in the U.S. Naval Reserve program for medical students during his years at university and upon graduation, he was obligated to complete his Navy service. He was appointed to the U.S. Naval Hospital in San Diego, California which was a large teaching hospital. Then in 1969 he was deployed to Vietnam aboard the USS Repose, a hospital ship. While based in Vietnam he treated acutely injured American soldiers and took care of many injured Vietnamese soldiers and civilians. Many of the cases required reconstruction. There were head and neck cancers and congenital defects as well.

After discharge from the Navy, Andy and Gloria moved to Miami, Florida where Andy joined the University of Miami School of Medicine faculty. He worked in the Department of Otolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery. They picked Miami as their future home due to the great climate that supported their interest in outdoor activities, especially tennis. Their second son John was born there in 1972.

Because of Andy's interest in the surgery specialties, he was soon board certified in both facial plastic surgery and cosmetic surgery. From the Miami School, he moved on to private practice and moved his family to Ft. Myers, Florida where he would eventually retire. During his career he was a member of multiple professional societies and published many papers regarding reconstructive surgery.

After retirement the family continued to live for 15 years in Ft Myers. In 2013 Gloria and Andy moved to Indian River Estates in Vero Beach which was known as a great retirement community. During the Covid pandemic, Dr. Andy wrote a weekly column in the Men's Fellowship newsletter that Rod Keefer published. His column always provided many great ways we could stay safer from the virus. He was a big proponent of Vitamin D3 among other things. Many of us were comforted by his advice and I know I personally benefitted! Andy continues to attend the Tuesday breakfasts now that we are back to 'normal' as far as Covid is concerned.

A vocal recital by Patrick J. Stella Celebrating 50 years of marriage



Dedicating this recital to his wife, it is his gift to her to show his love and appreciation for 50 years of her continual love and support. 
