In using this expression, Jesus is explicitly identifying himself as God, and bearing God's presence on Earth. The "I AM" statements found in the Gospel of John are beloved by so many and they are:

- I am the Bread of Life (John 6:35) ...
- I am the Light of the World (John 8:12) ...
- I am the Door (John 10:9) ...
- I am the Good Shepherd (John 10:11-14) ...
- I am the Resurrection and the Life (John 11:25) ...
- I am the Way and the Truth and the Life (John 14:6) ...
- I am the Vine (John 15:1-5)

The "I AM" statements affirm the identity of Jesus. Like all of us as we have grown and matured from childhood, we have sought to clarify our "identity," our "purpose," and our "destiny." Jesus does this in John through the seven "I AM" statements and each one of us, as followers of Jesus, can clarify our identity, purpose, and destiny through understanding them and the claims they reveal.

Wherever you are this April, whether in Indian River County, or at your other home, join us for this helpful, insightful, and faithful sermon series. It will add to your knowledge of the Christ and strengthen your relationship with the Divine!



PW News - April 2024

This year, First Presbyterian Church celebrates its 70th anniversary. The late Patsy Helseth, one of the founding members of our congregation wrote the following brief history of The Presbyterian Women's Organization of our church:

HOW WE BEGAN

On April 22, 1954, thirty-two ladies of the newly organized Presbyterian Church met at the home of Mrs. Alexander Ryburn and formed the Women's Association of the First Presbyterian Church of Vero Beach. Margaret Ryburn was elected President. During that first year, six meetings were held at homes of members and with the help of visiting ladies from the Fort Pierce Presbyterian Church, the women became acquainted with their part in the work of the

Church.

In 1955, the Women's Association met ten times with interesting programs, five of them being recommended by Presbytery. The attendance grew and that year the women furnished and equipped the kitchen in the new church with monies from the Bazaar. Their other projects included making layettes for the local County Welfare Office, donating to the recently purchased Presbyterian Home for the Aged at Lakeland, furnishing refreshments each Sunday evening for the Westminster Fellowship, supervising the purchasing of plants and flowers for the chancel and caring for those plans and also being in charge of decorations for the new Church's dedication and the two Christmas Sunday services. In 1956, the membership had increased tremendously and was given much help by the National Board of Christian Education. They hosted the district workshop where further valuable information was gained. That year, the use of membership cards, pledge cards and offering envelopes were introduced in order to formulate a budget and to meet Goals for Giving for the year.

Also, in 1956, four circles were formed with approximately twenty members each which met monthly. It was then that the circles began hosting the coffee hour after the 11 a.m. service.

The Association continued to grow, increasing its membership to one hundred and eighty in the sixties and by 1972 there were nine circles, each one very active in various Bible studies and projects in the Church. Submitted by Patsy Helseth, February 25, 2001

Today, our membership numbers 340 women. We meet on the first Monday of each month, 1:00 p.m. in the Schumann Conference Center. We support local charitable organizations as well as The Thornwell Home for Children (a Presbyterian mission of healing and hope for abused and neglected children), The Synod of South Atlantic and Living Waters, Columbia Friendship Circle (providing friendship and

support to Columbia Theological Seminary students and our Missionaries) and the Disaster Relief Fund of the Presbyterian Church (UPUSA).

Grace Circle meets every 2nd Monday of the month in the Earnshaw Room at 11:30 a.m. Fellowship/Bring-Your-Own-Lunch time follows the Bible Study.

The food industry continued to move them with stops in NJ and later London, England for RJR Nabisco. And finally to Cincinnati, Ohio for Chiquita where they put down roots for 10 years. They enjoyed all the travel and living in different cities throughout Doug's career.

When asked how they came to Vero Beach, Marilyn said that Doug's parents had a home in So. Florida where they could come for holidays and that they had friends here. They came to help his father after his mother had a stroke and when Doug retired, they decided to live in Vero Beach. They love their home in Riomar; they have joined the VB Yacht Club, attend the Opera and take advantage of the many activities that VB offers. Marilyn volunteers with the VNA for the annual golf tournament fund-raiser. In their retirement they explore the area with day trips and the simple pleasure of walking the beach and reading.

Hilary Dobson is enthusiastic about her new usher. "Marilyn is helpful and obliging". Marilyn's favorite Bible verse is Isaiah 40:31. "but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint"

Our residential campuses operate under a four-pillar philosophy: Work, Study, Play and Pray. We provide structure and stability with daily schedules including school, an on-campus job, chapel services and recreation activities. We believe these four pillars, along with counseling services, family engagement, and unconditional love and support from our staff, produce lawful, resilient, and productive citizens.
