Live Differently: Our Approach to Easter

As followers of our Lord Jesus Christ, we are not called to live the life that we lived before our call to Christ. We are called to live a new life. We are called to live in a different, more righteous, and loving manner. As we approach our celebration of Easter in 2023, how are we going to experience that new life? Because of what God has done for us in the empty tomb, how will it be different?

As we approach Easter, maybe we should think of this time in the same manner that an airplane approaches an airport. An airplane leaves the comfort of its cruising altitude to begin the descent to a specific location. To make that descent there are certain disciplines that need to be performed. The pilots need to slow down the aircraft. The pilots need to enter the landing pattern for that airport. The pilots need to adjust the planes ailerons, rudder, flaps, and trim. The pilots need to determine the angle of descent. And finally, the pilots need to land in a safe and productive manner.

As Christians, we approach Easter by engaging in the discipline of Lent. We have certain disciplines that we must pursue as we look to arrive at that specific location of the empty tomb. Like pilots of an airplane, we have certain disciplines in which we need to engage. These disciplines include study, reflection, discipline, penitence, and praise.

During Lent, as we approach Easter, we will be examining our new life in Christ. We will be celebrating that the old life is gone and the new life has begun. During Lent, the sermon series is entitled "Live Differently" because clearly that is what is asked of us. Flee from sin and move to God. The sermon series consists of eight sermons. All under the umbrella of living differently, each sermon will examine our "preparation" for Easter.

Profile of a Presbyterian Woman: Connie Gambill

With the Presbyterian Women's "Spring Garden Luncheon" just weeks away, Chairman Connie Gambill is increasingly excited about how it's shaping up. She said, "I think everyone will be incredibly inspired by our speaker from the Shining Light Garden. I recently had the chance to visit there and was awed by what I saw. What one man started as a backyard garden has grown into an all-volunteer operation that supplies free produce to food banks, homeless shelters, and others in need throughout Indian River County. It's really an amazing story."

While Connie joined our church just last year, she's been a First Presbyterian virtually all her life. Growing up in Mount Airy, NC – the hometown of TV's Andy Griffith!!! – she attended the First Presbyterian Church of Mount Airy with her parents and two siblings. Connie recalls her pride in earning per-



fect-attendance pins 13 years in a row for faithful Sunday School attendance. After graduating from what is now the University of Memphis, she briefly taught math in a Memphis middle school before returning to NC. There she taught a GED course in a community college and later math in a middle school.

Connie next moved to Fort Lauderdale, where she raised two daughters with her first husband and taught math at two schools, including 18 years at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic High School. And, yes, she was active in Fort Lauderdale's First Presbyterian Church and served on the Board of Directors for the church's retirement home for 13 years. Connie's personal life took an unexpected turn when a mutual friend introduced her to an attractive man with Franklin Templeton Investments who also hailed from NC. The two clicked immediately and today Connie & Jim treasure their blended family of 5 daughters and 9 grandchildren.

Over the years, the Gambills became familiar with Vero Beach on their occasional visits to various friends who had left Fort Lauderdale for the slower pace of Vero. Their decision to move was a sudden one. As Connie recounted, "One day Jim came home and said, 'Too much traffic; we're going to Vero Beach.'"

After a year of settling in, the Gambills found their church home in our "very friendly" congregation. And talk about "small world" . . . Connie learned that Dr. Tim's wife Stephanie had sung in the Kirk Singers, the high school choral group at Fort Lauderdale's First Presbyterian Church.

Connie is savoring an active retirement. She's taken on golf and spends relaxing hours creating paintings which she enjoys gifting to family and friends. The Gambills especially love to travel. Said Connie, "We've been to 60+countries. I keep a list."

Needless-to-say, we're grateful that this capable lady with her contagious zest for life is overseeing our Spring Garden Luncheon. Connie gave careful thought to what Bible verse most speaks to her and it's a beautiful one: Deuteronomy 31:8 "The Lord Himself goes before you and will be with you; He will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged."
